Ecumenical Events for September>>>

There are several ecumenical events or days of emphasis coming up and encouraged by the World Council of Churches and other ecumenical organizations. I'd like to highlight one in particular that Central Christian Church can participate on Friday, September 21.



International Day of Prayer for Peace (September 21, 2012): The World Council of Churches calls on the churches and congregations around the world to observe an **International**

Day of Prayer for Peace. The day coincides with the International Day of Peace initiated by the United Nations. The participants are especially invited to pray and act together for a just peace in communities, nations and the world. *Praying for Ceasefire* is the theme adopted this year by On Earth Peace, a United States-based agency rooted in the Church of the Brethren. "For some people, praying for ceasefire will mean praying for a break in armed conflict. For others, a ceasefire will mean ending conflict in their community, workplace, church or family." Go to:

- The participants are especially invited to pray and act together for a just peace in communities, nations and the world.
- Prayers from different parts of the world will be shared through online means, including Facebook and Twitter. People who are not active on these social media platforms may share their prayers by email.
- Prayers for a just peace lift up social, eco-

nomie, ecological or political-military aspects of peace. People who attended or followed last year's International Ecumenical Peace Convocation in Kingston, Jamaica, are invited to name initiatives carried forward from the convocation.

- Praying for Ceasefire is the theme adopted this year by On Earth Peace, a United States-based agency rooted in the Church of the Brethren. "For some people, praying for ceasefire will mean praying for a break in armed conflict. For others, a ceasefire will mean ending conflict in their community, workplace, church or family," said Matt Guynn of On Earth Peace.
- To commemorate the day, On Earth Peace also invites diverse congregations and groups to plan events including prayers, cultural sharing, music and the arts, to challenge violence in communities and to encourage action for peace.

The prayers for peace last year circled the globe from Cuba to Fiji, Indonesia, Rwanda, Germany and Canada. A parish in Wales, to cite one example, prayed for reconciliation and against military drones.

Observances of the peace prayer day began in 2004 as part of the ecumenical Decade to Overcome Violence (2001-2010) after an agreement between the heads of the WCC and the UN.

Upcoming observations will be World Communion Sunday on October 7, Fasting for the Poor the 1st Monday of Advent and Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in January. Watch for more information on those observances in later Clarions.

Grace and peace to you! On Sunday, September 9, at 3:00pm, Central Christian Church (DOC) will host the Ordination Service for Allissa Williams. This will be a monumental day for Allissa, Joe, and their family, and it will be a monumental day in the life of the church.

As part of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), we strongly affirm that *all* followers of Jesus Christ are called to the priesthood of all believers. Through baptism, each one of us becomes part of the Body of Christ, the church; we become Jesus' hands and feet, his voice and heart. We are entrusted to continue his ministry and to share our unique gifts and abilities to further God's reign in the world. All Christians are partners with each other and with God as we minister in Christ's name.

What, then, is ordination? “Within the ministry of the whole people of God there is, and has been since the early church, representative ministry called by God and set apart by the Church for distinctive functions. Authority and blessing to perform this ministry are celebrated in ordination. In ordination the church confirms in women and men the call of God, acknowledges in them the necessary gifts and graces, and accepts this ministry in and for the church.”

Allissa has worked hard for many years and the road that has led her to ordination has been a long one. To be asked to sponsor and/or host an ordination service for one of their own is a great honor and blessing for any congregation. 




The book signing will begin at 2 p.m. with a short question and answer period with Richard. Then he will begin the book signing for his newly published book The Spiritual Road: Helping Others Grow Spiritually. The book's purpose is to assist Christians to grow in their personal relationship with God and in mature Christ likeness in order to affect the Community of God in the world. Below is some biography information about Richard who began his ministry at Central Christian at our former church building on North 7th St.

Born to a tool maker and secretary, Richard A. Haynes began life in a mid-western blue-collar family. He suffered polio at age four which changed his life. As he battled the disease, he learned the art of using perseverance to overcome life challenges and focus on what was most important. He attended public schools while physically navigating with walking sticks and a leg brace. There, Richard became a national thespian, violinist, a fourth degree National Forensic League holder and a high school gymnast. Receiving an athletic scholarship to the University of



Louisville, Richard was the Intercollegiate Kentucky champion from 1967-1970 in parallel bars, pommel horse and still rings. After college, he became an ordained minister with the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) serving congregations in Indiana and Illinois. He obtained his Doctor of Ministry degree, with distinction, from Northern Baptist Theological Seminary in 1995. Dr. Haynes has been a spiritual director for over twenty-five years. He was also founder and Executive Director of Paraclete Retreat Center, Inc. whose sole purpose has been to encourage Christian spiritual growth and development. He and his wife Patricia have been married since 1976 and have one adult son.

As Dr. Haynes often states, "Nobody gets out of this world alive. God embodies you into this life; and when it ends, will you be ready to return to God?" What is most important in life is "spiritual growth and development." Thus, Dr. Haynes has focused his life on helping people grow spiritually. "There is a process to Christian spiritual growth and development. If you know what it is, then you can more easily cooperate with what God is trying to accomplish in you." Richard A. Haynes' book The Spiritu-



al Road: Helping Others Grow Spiritually is an in-depth examination of the step by step process he has gleaned through his thirty years of work in the field.


Spiritual Growth & Education >>>
