1. It take at least \$10,000 a month to run this church. That includes salaries, taxes and benefits, utilities and upkeep, mortgage, and our mission obligations.
2. Presently, we are \$12,000 behind in our pledged giving. If we were up to date, we would be \$4000 in the black. The committee planned the budget with pledges in mind and hoped to set aside extra money to help us through the difficult summer months. With vacations, family get-togethers and outings and other plans, our summer attendance always suffers. This means that our giving also suffers. Unfortunately, the bills to the church continue to come in on a regular basis.

We understand that situations change and some may not be able to continue their pledged amount. If so, please let us know so adjustments can be made in our expectations.

3. Our Senior Minister, Rebecca, will be away during our slowest months. This is not a time for sleeping in on Sundays or mowing the grass! Come to church, not only to support our student minister, Dori, but also to be renewed and refreshed with the love of Christ in this community of faith! Invite a friend to join you! Ask them to come share the love! If you are unable to attend, SEND IN YOUR PLEDGE IN A TIMELY MANNER, either with a friend or by mail.
4. Some of us may not realize that pledges do NOT include the special offerings such as Easter, Pentecost, or the mission trip; these are outreach gifts over and above our pledges.



“I have a dream” Speeches

The Declaration of Independence states that "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." Tell me where in that statement it says what the pursuit of Happiness is and it is only with someone of the opposite sex.

In a perfect world, people wouldn't judge other people by their sexual orientation. They wouldn't be condemned for the person that they choose to be their life partner or their soul mate. They wouldn't have to hide who they are from their parents, their family, and their friends. They wouldn't have to hide from society.

In a perfect world people would see that no matter whether you are gay, lesbian, bi-sexual, or straight, love is love and there isn't anything or anyone that can stop that. There is the strong belief in many people that there is love at first sight and that everyone has a soul mate. That soul mate is not always the person you think it is, the person you want it to be, or the person that others think you should be with. This soul mate is someone that loves you more than anything else, treats you like the king or queen that you are and puts your needs before anyone else's (even their own). That person, whether they are same sex or opposite sex, is the person that makes you happy. The person that you think about first in the morning and the last person you think about at night. They are your sun, your moon and your stars. To most of you that person is someone of the opposite sex and it is the best feeling when you find that person. But to others it is someone of the same sex and all of the sudden that wonderful feeling of being in love becomes something forbidden and has to be secretly hidden. In his speech to the public on May 9, 2012 Obama states "I want everyone treated fairly in this country. We have never gone wrong when we've extended rights and responsibilities to everybody. That doesn't weaken families, it strengthens families." I couldn't agree with him more.

My dream is for this vision to become a reality. A reality that no matter what State you live in or what your profession is, you are able to marry that one person that makes your heart flutter. Some people spend their entire lives searching for that person; let's not banish the one's that find each other just because they are not conventional. Some people are just really confused because when you read the bible, the constitution and the Emancipation Proclamation, by the time you are finished, you don't know what's right and what's wrong. All you really know is that the written word can be taken in many different ways. It's kind of like the old saying "beauty is in the eyes of the beholder". Well just as with beauty, the meaning of an

article is to be determined by the one that is reading it.

I understand that laws and constitutional rights separate church and state, but I cannot make my point clear without the conversation of viewpoints regarding the bible and that God condemns gays and lesbians. Again that is in the eye of the reader and often times the translator.


For instance, in Leviticus 18.22, it says “You shall not lie with a man as with a woman; it is an abomination.” Leviticus 20.13 says “If a man lies with another man as with a woman, both of them have committed an abomination; they shall be put to death; their blood upon them.” When actually reading these passages before they were translated, the word abomination actually said *toevah*, which means ritually unclean and it was used in a lot of other passages throughout the bible, mostly dietary laws. Meaning that if you eat red meat then you are *toevah* or unclean. Leviticus also forbids many things that we do in today’s society. For instance he states “You shall not round off the hair on your temples or mar the edges of your beard”. So does that mean that you are an abomination or that you are *toevah* is you shave and get your hair cut?

I’m not condemning anyone that lives solely by the bible, anyone that lives solely by the constitution or someone that only takes their own beliefs into consideration. I am simply saying that the world we live in today is not the same world that was here when the bible was created, when the emancipation proclamation was signed, or when the constitution was formed.

I will leave you with one last thought from Benjamin Franklin. “Sin is not harmful because it is forbidden, but it is forbidden because it is harmful.”

The bottom line is same sex marriage is not hurting anyone, not killing anyone, not starving anyone, but homophobia is hurting people and killing people every day. Let’s stop the hurting and the condemning and live in a country where we are lucky enough to have as many freedoms as we do and as we take for granted each and every day.


