Lord's Prayer Revisited

We have all memorized and said the **Lord's Prayer** many times in our lives. I have been thinking about it lately and I wanted to share some of my thoughts on a few phrases with you. We are spiritual beings on a spiritual journey and the Lord's Prayer is a very rich roadmap to be prayerfully considered along that journey.

**"Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven."** God's Kingdom is here and now. Our challenge is to overcome Jesus' comment that we have eyes that **do not** see and ears that **do not** hear. By our Faith and Baptism we are unconditionally loved; we are part of God's Kingdom **now**. Through prayer and study we learn how to live in and grow God's Kingdom. How do we know for sure we can bring God's Kingdom to life? We don't for sure but, if we are trying and want to do God's Will, His mercy will guide us and He is pleased that we are trying. Also, if we are growing in the love of God, ourselves, and others it is a true sign that we are bringing God's Kingdom to life. Finally, if we are less judgmental and more forgiving we are better at seeing and hearing how to do that.

"Give us this day our daily bread." I think we need to see that statement in a very inclusive manner; God will provide for all of our needs today. Our challenge is to live as much as we can in the "NOW," not dwelling in yesterday or worrying about tomorrow. Christ talked about not worrying about tomorrow on many occasions. Worry is another way we try to control the future which is almost always impossible and, in fact, robs us of the peace and joy that comes from living in the now.

**"Forgive us our sins as we forgive the sins of others."** We will sin – We are human. God through Christ knows that. The key is that when we don't judge others and when we forgive and love others we quit judging ourselves and then we can forgive and love ourselves. This is not an ego-centric love. In many ways the most challenging and difficult thing to do is to love ourselves. True grace and salvation comes because God always forgives us and loves us unconditionally. He gives us peace and joy to change us and bring His Kingdom to life. Accepting, believing, and living God's unconditional love is a lifelong journey of growing, falling back and then growing again. It is a wisdom that comes from experience and prayer. Our "job" is to bring the Kingdom of God to fruition and it is indeed a life-long task. We are to have eyes that DO see and ears that DO hear God's message and to live that message of unconditional love every day. Amen.

The summer is passing by quickly so it will only be 6 more weeks before our 22<sup>nd</sup> annual Jonah fish fry. This important event provides a great opportunity to bring the community into our church while raising funds to help with the Koinonia budget. Membership, fellowship and evangelist activities, including the cost of our ad in the Frontier phone book along with paper supplies for the kitchen, all fall under the Koinonia Ministry here at Central.

We aren't a large congregation but we work so well together each year to allow this event to occur. The outpouring of support in your generosity of donating food items and supplies along with the donation of your time is such a wonderful contribution to our church. We are truly blessed to have such a dedicated caring congregation.

If you are able to donate canned goods or other supplies needed, please see the little fish tags on the display board that list the items needed. The majority of the items are available at GFS Marketplace at 5000 S. 7<sup>th</sup> Street (no membership required). They give a rebate back to non-

I'm chair of the Outreach Committee for another year and I am so proud of the many things we continue to do as a congregation. We have six special collections throughout the church year that support the ministries of the Disciples of Christ in Indiana, the United States and around the world. ### Update on Finances >>>

While we are in the midst of the slow summer season, it is time to take stock of our budget situation. Each week the church needs over \$3,400 to meet all of it's obligations of salaries and benefits, mortgage, taxes, maintenance **and our numerous min-istries**. At this writing, the offerings for the last four Sundays were \$1386, \$4000, \$2766, and \$1766 for a deficit of \$3700 for the month. The previous month, we had a \$1700 deficit. We experience this summer slowdown ever year but this summer it has been especially acute. If this continues, we will have used all of our savings within the next three or four months. The church board and staff have worked hard to keep expenses down - decreasing them from last year.

As you can see above, our income is almost \$5000 lower than this time last year and we are \$12,713.11 behind in our pledged giving. Our office manager has repeatedly had to hold his check for the following week's deposit before he could cash it.

Even with our financial struggles, this church is doing some amazing ministry. We had another amazing Vacation Bible School with many visitors from outside the church. A successful mission trip to New Orleans has just concluded, with our youth challenged to become more engaged in God's mission for us. Are we ready for the challenge as well?

When we come together to worship, let us feel the joy of being in God's house and among our loving and supporting church family. Let us give from the heart for the many blessings we enjoy as people of faith. Give, not out of necessity, but out of gratitude. This church community will survive!!
