175th Extravaganza!!!!

Wonderful Plans from Christian Education for 175th Anniversary Year!

Christian Education is very excited to participate in our congregation's 175th anniversary in 2016. We continue to plan, but here are some of the events already in place.

We got a head start by attending the Pioneer Days at Fowler Park this fall. The pioneer village is set in the 1840s and has log cabins and other buildings of that time. There were village folk in period costume preparing crafts, food, and other chores of that time. Several of our children and adults were able to see and experience what life was like when our congregation was formed.

In January, our youth group will have an overnight lock-in. Among our activities will be discussion about our upcoming trip to Cane Ridge, Kentucky and sharing other information about events in 1841. Did you know the hand cranked ice cream maker was invented in New Jersey in 1841 by Nancy Johnson? Ice Cream socials were a big part of a church's social events at that time. We plan to have our own ice cream social that evening too.

Last spring, Will Hine gave a tour to several children, youth, and adults of the Shrine of Saint Mother Theodore Guerin and other shrines and sacred places of the Sisters of Providence as they celebrated their 175th anniversary. We hope to again visit these places this coming spring as we continue to learn about life and religion in that time period.

In June, members of our congregation will make a pilgrimage to the Cane Ridge Meetinghouse in Kentucky where our denomination's movement was born. We will attend the annual Cane Ridge Days celebration as we learn about our history, and we also hope to visit other historical Disciples sites in that area. Our youth and leaders will remain in Lexington for a few extra days to do mission work with local Disciples congregations and social service organizations.

We will have an 1841 theme for our annual Vacation Bible School next summer with materials from the Disciples of Christ *Bethany Village* curriculum. We plan to have games, activities, and snacks of that time period.

Christian Education will be working with Sunday school teachers throughout the year to incorporate more information about our congregation and denomination in 1841.

All performances start at 4:00 p.m.



“When the religious leaders saw the **outrageous** things Jesus was doing, and heard all the children running and shouting through the Temple, “Hosanna to David’s Son!” they were up in arms and took him to task. “Do you hear what these children are saying?” Jesus said, “Yes, I hear them. And haven’t you read in God’s Word, ‘From the mouths of children and babies I’ll furnish a place of praise?’” (Matthew 21:15-16)

On June 28, 1841, 13 men became the charter members of Central Christian Church in Terre Haute, Indiana. The Cane Ridge Revival, which is cited as the beginning of the movement that became the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), took place in 1801. Central Christian Church has been a Christian witness and presence in Terre Haute for almost 175 years. This is an incredible accomplishment! And definitely a milestone worth celebrating.

One of the things Elder and longtime church member Betsy Hine said to the Board was that we need to come up with some **outrageous** ideas and goals to mark this anniversary. I think we have! I also pray that we will be open to whatever other **outrageous** ideas God will inspire us to consider throughout 2016.

I strongly encourage you to read through this edition of the Clarion as many dates and details are included for how we will be celebrating this year. Other events and plans will be shared as they come together.

I invite you to join me in prayer as we go through this special and **outrageous** year. Above all, may many, many more people come to know Central Christian and the power of God’s love and grace at work among us. 
