

CCC BIG Read Continues with “Leviticus”

As of the last week of February, we are up to 34 people participating in the CCC BIG Read! If you have not yet finished the book of Exodus, do your best to keep going and move toward Leviticus.

The second half of Exodus is the story of what happens to the Hebrews after they escape slavery in Egypt. The people embark on forty years of wilderness wanderings, God begins the process of giving the (613) commandments to the Hebrews, and elaborate and intricate instructions are given for the creation of the Tent of God’s Presence. Yes, it can be tedious reading at some points because we do not always recognize (on the surface) what colors, numbers, symbols, etc. meant for our faith ancestors, but never doubt that it was important to them.

Leviticus is named for the tribe of Levi who were dedicated as the priests of the people. The majority of this biblical book is a “reference” manual for the priesthood. The theme that runs throughout these lessons and regulations is the emphasis on God’s holiness and how the people were to live/embody this holiness.

Again, please keep in mind that the way our faith ancestors experienced God is often very different from how we do. The commandments and other “rules” were written to mark the people as distinct from others who did not have the same covenantal relationship with God as they did.

Leviticus has 27 chapters so you can read one a day during the month of March!

WORSHIP MINISTRY

We are well into Lent by now as Easter comes very early this year. Palm Sunday is March 20 and Easter Sunday is March 27. By observing the forty days of Lent, the individual Christian imitates Jesus' withdrawal into the wilderness for forty days. Some faithful observe fasting and/or some sort of self-denial during Lent but however one chooses to keep Lent, the purpose is to set aside time for prayer and reflection on Jesus Christ - his suffering and his sacrifice, his life, death, burial and resurrection. This year we have been on a journey through Lent. Where will the journey lead us? It leads us to Palm Sunday and the triumphal entry into Jerusalem where Jesus will celebrate the Passover with His Disciples. The young people will lead us into the Palm Sunday service waving the traditional palms. The service will take us to the triumph but will prepare us for the betrayal, capture, torture and trial of Jesus. Maundy Thursday celebrates the Passover with the choir leading Table Prayer. On Good Friday we will commemorate the Crucifixion of Jesus at our sister church, St. Mark UCC, on Fruitridge Ave. Both services start at 7 p.m.

Maundy Thursday service at Central Christian at 7:00 on March 24;

Good Friday service at St. Mark UCC at 7:00 on March 25;

Easter Sunday on March 27 will start with a sunrise service in CCC's memorial garden beginning at 7:15. Afterwards there will be a breakfast starting about 7:45.

The journey leads us to **Easter Sunday** service at 9:30 when we unpack the Alleluia banner and celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. The journey has been long but we have been nourished by the bread of meditation, prayer, song and the spoken word each Sunday.

Easter Flowers: Dates and order blanks for Easter Flowers will be out soon.

THE 175 FUND REPORT

Monday, January 22, 2016

Doug Sloan, Chair Faith & Giving Ministry

The 175 Fund added \$377.50 to the January 2016 mortgage payment.

The 175 Fund added \$11,480.00 to the February 2016 mortgage payment.

The 175 Fund has \$302.50 for the March 2016 mortgage payment.

The 175 Fund has substantially contributed to reducing the mortgage by \$13,239.81 to the current balance of \$197,683.61.

The most important part of contributing to **The 175 Fund** is to continue making your Pledge offering. After you make your Pledge offering, then determine in what extraordinary way you can contribute to **The 175 Fund**. It will take the same level of giving – and more – that we made in February to pay off the mortgage this year. The good news is that **The 175 Fund** has an outrageous start.
