

## *Rebecca's Revelation*

Grace and peace to you in the name of Jesus Christ! Well, the season of Lent is winding down; soon we will observe the events of Holy Week and look forward to the glorious celebration of Easter. The season of Lent evolved from the practice of the early church of designating a time of preparation for all who were considering baptism and dedicating their lives to Christ. Our Disciples of Christ tradition of Pastor's class is reminiscent of this example from our faith ancestors.

Every Pastor's class group of students is different and has its own "personality." I have been honored to share Pastor's class this year with four adults and two young people. I do not know, yet, how many in this class will decide to be baptized; in what they have shared, though, it is clear that they have already made the decision to follow Jesus and his ways in our world. This leads me to ponder the question of membership in the church and living one's life as a Christian.

A dedicated group of CCC church members have been evaluating and revising our congregation's Constitution and By-Laws. It is important to do so on a regular basis and we want these documents to accurately reflect who we are as a faith community and to guide us as we carry out the vision God has placed upon us. As a result, we have had some very thought-provoking conversations about "membership" and what constitutes membership in our congregation.



In my own experience, I have watched people who know little, if anything, about CCC get caught up in the joy of worship during their first visit with us and come forward to place membership...and then we never see them again. I have worked with people in our church who are very dedicated to Christ and to the vision of CCC, only to realize later that they have never actually made a confession of faith or officially transferred their membership from another congregation. I also know people who want nothing to do with church life of any kind, will never have membership in any faith community, and yet every aspect of their lives reflects God's love and grace and they work every day to

make the world the place God intends for it to be.


As we prepare for Easter, what difference does Jesus Christ make in your life? Whether you are a member of Central Christian, another congregation, or you do not have membership in any faith community, in what ways do you live Christ's example and ways in our world?

## *The BIG Read to Spend Two Months with the Psalms*

Hello, BIG Readers! I am so excited that we are beginning the Book of Psalms! For many years, when people have asked me how to pray or what to say in prayer, I tell them to read through the psalms – not because I think we should talk with God using the same poetic language, but because the variety of emotions expressed teaches and reassures us that there is NOTHING we can't share with God.



The Book of Psalms is actually the Hymnal of the ancient Jewish people. Our faith ancestors were amazing musicians, and whether celebrating and praising, or grieving and lamenting, they had a gift for writing songs for the occasion. In fact, the Rev. Verity Jones once wrote that "The Book of Psalms might be called [the] greatest hits of the Hebrew people." We no longer know what the tunes sounded like, but the words, images, and ideas collected in the Psalms continue to guide us in our own worship and relationship with God.

A bit of trivia: Psalm 119 is the longest chapter in the Bible (176 verses) and Psalm 117 is the shortest (2 verses). For April, I recommend reading 3 psalms (or chapters) a day. This should get us to Psalm 90 by the end of the month. We will then read the rest of the book in May.

If you have not been keeping up with the readings – IT DOES NOT MATTER!! Jump back in with Psalms. They were not written in the order we have them and they cover many time periods in the history of the Jews. And please email something to the group once in a while – even if it is only "I like this," or "I really dislike this."

## **WORSHIP MINISTRY**

Moving from Lent to Easter 2017

We will be in the last weeks of Lent by the time of this Clarion. Looking ahead, we focus on preparing for Palm Sunday (April 9), Holy Week and Easter Sunday (April 16). There will be information and order forms for ordering flowers for Easter in memory and in honor of the special people in your lives in the bulletins on March 26, April 2 and 9; or, look on the CCC webpage and the weekly emails for this information. Madonna will be placing orders with Apple House on April 10.

Palm Sunday will be April 9; Passover this year begins the evening of April 10 and ends the evening of April 18. Holy Week services will be Maundy Thursday (April 13) and Good Friday (April 14). This year the Maundy Thursday service will be at St. Mark UCC on Fruitridge and the Good Friday service will be at Central Christian. Both services start at 7:00 p.m. The Good Friday service at CCC will be a Taizè service. We will have a sunrise service on Easter morning, April 16; the time for that will be announced later.

Be in church during the rest of the Lenten season as the worship services guide us during this time of reflection and preparation through the scriptures and prayers of the service, the spoken word of Rev. Rebecca's sermons, and music that will help us focus on the theme of "Conversations with Jesus." All these are carefully planned to help lead us along the path to the Resurrection on Easter Sunday.

Easter Sunrise Service will begin at 7AM in the Memorial Garden with breakfast immediately after this special service.

Thank you so much for your support and prayers for this important event. We may not be a large congregation, but we have a wonderful history of accomplishing great things by working together!


