

There were over 50 members of the congregation who helped with the "Hanging of the Greens," read special parts, carried Advent candles, prepared candles for Christmas Eve, obtained gluten free communion bread, or helped direct those taking part. That number doesn't include all of you who faithfully attended worship, sang in the choir, served as Elders and Deacons, prepared communion, and brought items for the fellowship time. The message here is that it takes all of us to create this special time of loving and serving God together.

#### CCC BIG Read

#### CCC BIG Read Concludes!

Our first ever CCC BIG Read concludes at the end of January 2019! Congratulations to all of you who made it through to the end! Congratulations if you made it through some of the BIG Read! And you know what? It is never too late to start! Yes, you can read the final books EVEN if you haven't read anything else!

I, 2, and 3 John were written after a split in the writer's faith community (shocker: Christians were known to fuss and feud with each other from...the beginning). Still, one scholar claims that the word *love* occurs 62 times in these three very short epistles. The writer strongly asserts that Jesus was a human being, as opposed to those who claimed he was a spirit that only appeared to be human. Although it is wonderful that the author stresses the importance of love, he intends for love to be shared strictly within the congregation.

The Book of Jude is an unusual piece of writing — even for the Bible! Tradition says that Jude was a brother of Jesus, but no one really knows who exactly he was nor when exactly this was written. What we do know is that false teachers have convinced some Christians that it is OK to mix cultural values and religious practices with what Christ taught. In a rather harsh tone, the writer urges the congregation to turn back to its roots.

Revelation is one of the most (if not the most) misunderstood books in the Bible. The author, John of Patmos, actually intends for this book to one of great hope for Christians. Beyond all the symbolic language, significant numbers, and incredible visions, John calls for Christians to remain passionately steadfast in the faith.

Combining all 5 books, there are 30 chapters. Read one every day in the month of January – just do it!
