



Working together so that peace may prevail




We are the youth from Central Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). We went to Lexington, KY., to work with homeless people. While we were there we saw a peace pole. We are working to demonstrate what the peace pole, in front of the main entrance to our church, means to us.

Each of the four sides has the same phrase about peace in different languages. First we chose English because that's the language of our congregation. We chose Dakota, a Native American language, because we have people with Native American backgrounds. Then we chose Spanish because we have people with Spanish backgrounds. Then we chose a language from India because we have a family in our church with that dialect. Unfortunately the company who makes the poles did not have that language. So after much discussion we chose Arabic – because we believe that most Arabic people are peace lovers like most of us. This was especially important in our congregation because it represents equality and shows we are all one in God's eyes. We are trying to break down cultural barriers and set aside negative stereotypes.

We dedicated the peace pole in memory of Hannah Crist, a youth in our congregation who had died. We wanted to honor Hannah's memory and call us all to peace. The words on the peace pole are "May Peace Prevail on Earth."

We the youth at Central Christian Church want to share this message with you. In this time of violence and mass shootings may we all work together so that peace may prevail on earth.

Our Building

As you drive up to Central Christian Church you are first impressed by the beautiful grounds and thick lush grass. Then you see the stunning church building and you are even more impressed with this timeless facility. It has been 29 years since we moved into this building on an April morning in 1990. This structure is used for many church functions as well as many community meetings. We are proud to share our church with our friends.

Like most of you I have failed to see the flaws that are beginning to happen to this 29-year old structure. One flaw is the windows. There are six windows that are in need of replacement or repair at this time. One window in the nursery is in serious condition and is boarded up until it can be replaced. The Property Ministry has received three bids from local window contractors. They all say that age and weather have caused this wood rot damage, and we are sorting through the bids to determine our best option. As we go forward with this process we will keep you apprised of this project that looks to be an expensive one and one that may mean the need for a capital campaign to meet the financial obligation that goes with it.

Please keep our church building in your prayers that a good outcome is ahead for us.




