Board meetings are open for any member and/or associate member to attend, unless otherwise specifically stated ahead of time.





Our current worship series at Central Christian, God Revealed!, will continue throughout the month of February.



Beginning in March, Central Christian via OUTREACH, will begin collecting Granola Bars and Soups to benefit the Food Pantry at United Campus Ministries. This will be an ongoing collection throughout the year. Various churches in the area will be collecting other needed items. Outreach has selected these non-perishable food items for Central Christian to provide.

Our hope is that you will purchase a couple extra items each time you do your normal grocery shopping and then bring them to the church. We will continually take the collected items to the UCM Food Pantry to be distributed, as needed to students who are food insecure. A few things to keep in mind is that there are students from many different countries, cultures and dietary needs and so a variety of items would be appreciated. Some students will have a Kosher, vegetarian or vegan preference, etc, while others have no dietary restrictions at all.

Soups can be condensed canned, or ready to eat canned, dry boxed or the instant "cup of soup" types. A variety is appreciated, such as chicken and noodle, tomato, vegetable, lentil, beef vegetable or bean soups. Granola bars can be crunchy, chewy, plain, fruit and nut or peanut butter types. Any brands of soups or granola bars are perfectly fine.

Thank you so very much for helping to feed students by providing these always needed items for the UCM food pantry.

I was also more than a little surprised by the relief so many expressed after the votes were calculated. This, plus numerous thoughts and observations that were shared regarding Holy Cow at the meeting on Sunday, January 16 made me realize that as a congregation this was the most faithful decision to make at this time. Perhaps not doing Holy Cow will give us time and space for God to lead us to other ministries and other fund-raising possibilities.

If you served at any time on the Holy Cow Planning Team – thank you!! If you sold tickets during any year of this event – thank you! If you showed up on that weekend/day to help in any way – thank you! If you prayed for this fundraiser's success and for those organizing and planning it – thank you!! We learned a lot because of Holy Cow and we will always have the good memories that we shared because of it.

Church, thank you for your prayerful decision-making and for your devotion to God and Christ's ministry through what we do together as a faith community.
