UNITED CAMPUS MINISTRIES






To date, Central Christian Church (DOC) has collected 71 lbs. of rice for the food pantry of United Campus Ministries since the beginning of the year. Our rice collection continues to be a

great aid in allowing students, especially those from other countries where rice is a staple, to prepare foods that are familiar to their palates.





The results are in, and St. Mark UCC was the winner of the Souper Bowl of Caring Food collection for the United Campus Ministries' food pantry. They collected 429 lbs of food and with their average weekly attendance of 20, that makes their average "pounds collected per person" to be 21.45 lbs.



Overall, the food pantry was the BIG winner with over 4110 lbs. of food collected by eight local congregations! That's over 2 tons of food! The total is more food than was donated to the pantry in all of 2023! Incredible and wonderful are the words that best describe this incredible outpouring of love! The once bare food pantry shelves are completely full after the Soupler Bowl of caring



Central Christian had a great showing as well with 337.8 lbs of food donated and a weekly average of 54 people for an average of 6.25 lbs. per person. Thank you to every single person who helped make this friendly competition such a success!



During the month of March, Outreach will have letters addressed to our members of congress available to sign regarding Bread for the World to help fight hunger. Rebecca's Revelation

"Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends."

(1 Corinthians 13:4-8a)

"God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them."

(1 John 4:16b)

Grace and peace to you in the name of Jesus Christ! As I write this column we are preparing for the start of Holy Week and the celebration of the Easter season. Our worship series for Lent 2024 has been *What's Love Got To Do with It?* Truth is, this question is always an important one for those of us who follow Jesus and not limited to just one Lenten season.

The above verses from 1 Corinthians are often heard at weddings; however, the apostle Paul writes them to the troubled, fussing and feuding Christians in Corinth to remind them of how *love* is demonstrated within community. Often when we find the word *love* in the scriptures, especially in the New Testament, it refers to *action*, not *emotion*. We can show love for others by wanting and working for the best for them – even if we don't like them.

As more people attend our adult Sunday school class and Bible Study groups at Central Christian, I am struck again with the realization that far too many people have been taught messages and images of Jesus that have little to do with who he was as a human being and what his actual ministry was. The media does not help as it seems those who have the loudest "Christian" voices know a very different Jesus from the one I know in the scriptures, tradition and my own experience.

To love as Jesus calls us to love is to pray for people I know and people I don't, people who will always have a place in my heart and those who have hurt me deeply, those who agree with me on all that I cherish and those who seem intent on destroying what I cherish. Love is an action.

To love as Jesus calls us to love is to reach out to those who are going through difficult times by emailing, calling or visiting them, by offering a listening ear, by reminding them they are not alone and this has nothing to do with how I *feel* about them personally. Love is an action.

To love as Jesus calls us to love is to try to be a positive or compassionate presence in my interactions with serve staff at restaurants, sales clerks, my mail person, the other adult dancers in my dance class, with those who visit Central Christian, with the crusty elderly man at the San Diego Maritime Museum who griped to me about California politics and his mother-in-law who had died long ago (granted, I cut him off after 10 minutes), with a little girl who lost her parents at a hotel...Love is an action.

To love as Jesus calls us to love is to give what I can to the UCM Food Pantry, Disciples Special Offerings, school supply drives, my nephew's traveling baseball fund, Lego sets to Aaron's LEGOcy, children's Christmas gifts through Central's Angel Tree, donations to Color of Change and Week of Compassion. Love is an action.

To love as Jesus calls us to love is to contact elected representatives about legislature I think prohibits God's realm from spreading in the world and voting for those who express concern for all people who live in our country rather than just some. Love is an action.

What's Love Got To Do with It? How we embody and share love in our world IS what it is about for those of us who follow the Risen Christ. In our acts of love God is known and experienced.
